MIGUEL PAREDES

Miguel Paredes was born in New York in 1966. He is an artist and urban realist who combines the exhilarating sense of New York graffiti art with the skill and perceptiveness of a truly exceptional artist.

Growing up on 72nd Street in the Upper West Side of Manhattan, Paredes exuded early signs of artistic ability and accepted an invitation to New York City's prestigious Fiorello La Guardia High School of Music and Art – immortalized in the musical and movie Fame – in the early 1980s. His studies at Fiorello coincided with the explosion of street culture in the city. Paredes drew inspiration from notorious pop artists like Andy Warhol and Keith Haring and plunged headlong into the world of graffiti and pop art taking the name "Mist" as his moniker.

Another influential figure in Paredes' artistic career is his mentor, Ronnie Cutrone. Cutrone was Andy Warhol's immediate assistant at the Factory during the notorious pop artist's most productive and prestigious years. To Paredes, his mentor's paintings are the essence of pop: colorful, lively and highly accessible. Cutrone's constant use of bright and fluorescent colors not only influenced Warhol's return to such hues, but shaped Paredes' color palette choices as well. Paredes' piece "Ronnie, is that you?" pays homage to Cutrone and features one of Paredes' sons painted on a vintage Mickey Mouse bed cover. The child represents the artist looking for Ronnie.

Paredes left New York to come to bourgeoning Miami Beach and took a studio at the Art Center of South Florida, where he became one of their most prosperous artists, focusing on mixed media and conceptual art. At one of his first showings he sold every piece in the exhibit and broke solidly into the Miami Beach art scene. His artistic success caught the attention of several local venues and they often offered their space to showcase Paredes' work. He ultimately opened his own gallery, Miguel Paredes Fine Art Gallery, in the Wynwood Arts District in August 2010. That same year, Paredes created an 18x26 foot mural titled "Pulgha World" in the heart of the Wynwood Arts District as a donation to the neighborhood.

In February 2011, the artist relocated Miguel Paredes Fine Art Gallery to a larger Wynwood space and unveiled his first 3D interior mural entitled "Brownstone Lounge" – a collaborative project with Miami-based interior designer, 3D specialist Jeff Vaughan and celebrated Broadway scenic designer and producer Antonio Marion, CEO of Marion Theatrical Productions in New York City. A month later, Paredes donated a mosaic mural entitled "The New Yorker/Senator" to the Miami Design Preservation League's Art Deco Welcome Center located in the heart of South Beach. The artist became the first Miami-Dade resident to ever receive two simultaneous proclamations from the City of Miami Beach and Village of Pinecrest honoring his support of historic preservation, devotion to the city and positive impact on the community.

In an effort to continue his commitment to the community and dedication to charitable public art works, Paredes was joined by Mayor Cindy Lerner to unveil two separate charitable art projects at Pinecrest Elementary in October of 2011: an expansive, permanent 24-foot, tile mosaic and a custom-painted dog sculpture, which is part of the SmARTy Dog for SmART Schools program, commissioned to raise money for electronic "Smart Boards" to be installed in classrooms.

Miguel Paredes was named the official artist of the 12th Annual Latin GRAMMY® Awards. The Latin Recording Academy® announced at the September Nominee Press Conference that Paredes has received the highly acclaimed honor of being the commissioned artist to create the artwork for the VIP event invitation, commemorative show tickets, collectible poster and official program book for the industry's pinnacle recognition of Latin music.

As a judge in the 2011 BOMBAY SAPPHIRE® Artisan Series, Paredes supported the efforts of BOMBAY SAPPHIRE®, Russell & Danny Simmons' Rush Philanthropic Arts Foundation and Complex Media to launch a nationwide search to identify the finest undiscovered talent in the field of visual arts. South Florida's regional competition was held at his gallery during a semi-finals event on October 22, 2011. The finale event took place during Art Basel 2011 co-hosted by Russell Simmons.

Paredes has also signed on with ACME Archives to create custom artwork for Disney Underground, which celebrates the interpretations of a new generation of visual artists stemming from the urban underground pop art movement. Chris Jackson, Acme's Director of Creative Affairs and Product Development notes, "Miguel's inspired take on the urban-pop movement makes him a perfect fit for Acme's Disney Underground line. Mr. Paredes' Disney work is showcased among the top tier of Acme's licensed art in galleries worldwide including the new Acme Gallery at FAO Schwartz Fifth Ave in New York.

Paredes is well known for his iconic, Japanese anime-inspired digital series PulghaTM & Birds. In this delightful collection, PulghaTM, a magical flea, and her friends, the spirited Birds Yori & Kosue, join forces for good. The William Morris Endeavor Agency has signed on to represent the PulghaTM collection to develop a branded cartoon series as well as other licensing opportunities for Paredes' designs and products. An additional animated sitcom, "The Wheelies" is under development. The show bases much of its humor on parodying American pop culture, politics and the human condition. It is represented by the Revolutus Agency.

In January of 2012, Paredes partnered up with Alex Cesaria of Unix Fine Art. Cesaria signed on to represent Miguel and curate the Miguel Paredes Fine Art Gallery. UNIX represents and carries works from renowned and established artists such as Warhol, Keith Haring, Roy Lichtenstein, Damien Hirst, Os Gemeos, Peter Anton, Max Wiedemann, Shepard Fairey, Miguel Correa, Alex Guofeng Cao, Zhong Biao, Chen Man and many others. Over the course of the year, Unix will showcase a rotating series of artists alongside Paredes' extensive collection.


Paredes is breaking new ground in exciting and innovative art movements. He continues to make his mark by further expanding his inspirational environment and simultaneously showcasing his works at local, national and international shows. In 2012, Paredes has upcoming exhibitions planned in London, China, and Seoul. Korea.

As an extension of his artistic career, in 1998 Paredes noticed a trend of nightclubs distributing flashy flyers and, drawing from his extensive knowledge of Japanese animation and comic book characters, he decided to overcome his fear of computers and purchased a Macintosh. The very first flyer he produced was such a hit among management and patrons of the trend-setting nightclub, Groove Jet, that the club immediately designated him as their sole designer. Other clubs caught on and from this grew his multi-million dollar, nationwide graphic design and printing company, PK Graphics. The company now services printing needs for 75,000 clubs nationwide and numerous corporate accounts. PK Graphics is the largest postcard printer in the United States and is an industry leader for printing affordable, fast and high impact material.



'A LANDMARK PIECE'

MIGUEL PAREDES' NEW MURAL. 'PULGHA WORLD,' BRINGS A NEW ARTISTIC TWIST TO MIAMI'S WYNWOOD ARTS DISTRICT

Taking an evening stroll through Miami's Wynwood's Arts District with his poodle, Canadian Brgron Jean came to a halt when one of the area's latest art piece, Miguel Paredes' mural titled Pulgha World, stood out.

"It's beautiful," said Jean, who is a painter. "I love it."

Jean was one of many art lovers who admired the unveiling of Pulgha World, which translates to "Flea World" in Spanish.

(Flea is actually spelled pulga, but Paredes adds an "h" in his

The piece was presented at Wynwood's Second Saturday art walk recently.

A New York native, Paredes installed the 18-by-26-foot mosaic mural on the side of a building at 2399 NW Second Ave., which is the home of Mizrach Realty Associates and multiple art studios.

While the Wynwood area is known for its murals, graffiti and urban art, Jean said Paredes' work has some different features than the others.

"It's very detailed; it has great definition and design," said Jean, who lives in Davie, "It looks like Japanese anime, which has a great influence."

Pulgha World is made up of 550 tiles dedicated to bring variety and a splash of vibrant colors to the area's urban streets.

It includes an iconic diminutive anime flea, which is part of Paredes' concept for a children's storybook, where the insect serves as an educational tool by promoting environmental conservation and green initiatives.

In the collage, the flea is a magical insect showcasing New York City's skyline as a backdrop. Colorful flowers and birds, a geisha and three children spray painting are featured.

The children also appeared in his signature oil painting series Los Niños, a dedication to his

"I wanted to have something unique," Paredes said, while pointing at the mural. "I could have gotten on a scaffold and painted, but it wouldn't have turned out like this."

But the piece does have some of the Wynwood's flavor as there is tag-style writing, which

looks like graffiti. Paredes' friend, Ari Dispenza of Mizrach Realty Associates, approached the artist about the possibility of creating the mural about two months ago.

"It's a landmark piece in the area," Dispenza said. "There's a lot of great ones out there. We are proud to have his piece on our building."

The mural is a first for Parades in the area and served as a preview of his personal art gallery scheduled to open in Wynwood later in the summer.

Paredes is known for his crossover artwork. His style is pop art, oil painting and sculp-

Aside from the art, Paredes, an urban impressionist, is also the owner and founder of PK Graphics, a multimillion-dollar printing company. A New York native, he developed his artistic

skills during the early 1980s as a student at the city's Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music, Art and Performing Arts. He later moved to South Florida and now lives in Pinecrest.

To put the mural together, Paredes sketched it on paper and later converted it digitally. Soon after, he printed the drawing on a large printing press using more than 500 tiles. It took four days to install the mural.

But Parades' mural wasn't the only artwork being highlighted at the Wynwood art walk. Several gallery shops opened to display their latest pieces. Paredes said the area is full of talent willing to be recognized.

It is time for Miami to look at these artists who are designers and so forth because they can create and do more city projects," said Paredes, who helps promote new artists.

Art infuses Miguel Paredes' life, from his work as CEO of PK Graphics, a graphic design and printing company, to his eponymous Paredes Fine Art Gallery, where he displays the graffiti-inspired art that he has been making since growing up in New York City. Shortly after arriving in Miami at 20, Paredes took a studio at the Art Center of South Florida. At his first local showing, he sold every piece. While painting is arguably his primary means of expression, Paredes dabbles in other media: He just produced a limited-edition set of cast fiberglass sculptures as well as a line of collectible toys, featuring the anime flea Pulgha and birds Yoli and Kosue, characters that he created himself.

Watershed moment: "In the sixth grade, I painted a samurai on a 24x36 board for an art school competition, and I won. It involved all grades in junior high, and it was a big deal for a sixth-grader to beat some of the artists in the eighth grade."

Figures of his imagination: "Pulgha is definitely one of my greatest creations. I always wanted a character that I could call my own and that has the potential to deliver a positive message and at the same time is extremely marketable and mainstream."



When Martine Zinn is not at her day job promoting the family's extensive automotive businesses — nine dealerships in south Florida — she's perfecting her passion: Life drawing in charcoal.

"Working on my art puts me in a very Zen place, particularly practicing the art of seeing," says Zinn, who is taking classes at the Boca Museum of Art School. "Drawing enables me to see things very differently. Your hand and the tool you are holding — charcoal, pencil, brush, whatever — touches the paper or canvas, yet at the same time it is touching and connecting with what you are drawing. What inspires me is making that connection."

All about the kids: After studying art in college, Zinn took a job as a teacher. "Children need to be exposed to art in our schools so the right hemisphere of their brains is developed. Our world is incredibly left-brain oriented, with technology, computers, etc. Kids that develop their right brains are better at pretty much everything."

Do not disturb: "My dream scenario is being able to work right out of my home with no distractions. It sounds simple, but it's not. I am sure this is why many of my artistic friends have off-site studios."

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

Miguel Paredes is the official artist for the 12th annual Latin Grammy awards. At the recent nominations press conference, the Miami-based painter was hanging with some of music's biggest singers including 2011 ten-time nominees Calle 13, regional Mexican singer Pepe Aguilar, Mexican singer/songwriter Reyli Barba, Chilean singer Myriam Hernandez and Mexico's Los Tucanes de Tijuana, among others.

Paredes' artwork will be used as the official image of the Latin Grammys including the cover of the awards invitation, show tickets, the poster and program book.

During the press conference, Paredes showcased his official Latin Grammy poster and afterwards spoke to the media about his influences, which include nature, Japanese animation, graffiti and pop-culture. Paredes also said his was inspired by his own musician paintings.

"I did a series called 'Salseros' about four years ago when I painted some of the great masters like **Mongo Santamaria**, **Hector Lavoe** and **Willie Colon**," Paredes said. "But initially the inspiration was (percussionist) **Sammy Figueroa** who is a good friend of mine back in Miami. I said, 'Sammy, let me paint you playing the congas.' I created that painting and from there I created a whole series."

The Latin Grammy awards will be held at the Mandalay Bay Events Center in Las Vegas on Nov. 10 and will air live on the Univision network at 8 p.m. ET (7 p.m. Central).

Over the years, Paredes has taken the art scene by storm, selling out venues and becoming one of the most popular local artist in Miami Beach and abroad.





Molly is Not a Hipster: Miguel Paredes and Kyle William Harper at The Paint Yard



Miguel Paredes, Outlaw

Growing up on Manhattan's Upper West Side was an advantage for graffiti kids in the early '80s, but the street action seldom built fine art chops. Back in the day, Miguel Paredes used the handle "Mist" bombing walls, while he got a leg up in artsville at New York's Fiorello La Guardia High School of Music and Art, which gained notoriety in the play and movie Fame. Decades later, he's a force in Miami's Wynwood Arts District, a regular at Art Basil in Miami Beach, has been represented by UNIX Fine Art (home to the likes of Banksy and Shephard Fairey in London and Miami), and has received commissions from Disney Underground, the venerable firm's urban art division. But Paredes credits his mentor Ronnie Cutrone for giving him an edge. And no wonder. Cutrone, known for his Felix the Cat renditions, was Andy Warhol's right-hand man at The Factory during the '70s, and is still in the saddle. And while

Paredes utilizes both graffiti stylings and cartoon quotes in his painting, those are just two arrows in his quiver.

You can see a sweet collection of his current work at The Paint Yard this month, which is exhibiting Paredes and L.A. artist Kyle William Harper through March 22. Paredes' pieces feature spray cap and manga riffs, and when he feels like it, straight-ahead portraiture added to his rambunctious compositions that would make many a drawing instructor jealous. Recently, Paredes has been spending time in L.A., and so has brought his friend Harper to the SA show.

Harper's work is less eclectic than Paredes', and is often a collage-like array of American cartoon imagery. He spent years traveling the world following the Grateful Dead tour as an extreme "Deadhead," and used those road skills and time in skater culture to find respect as a fine artist in L.A., and has gone on to curate shows in Berlin and Hollywood.

So, why is this talent in SA?

If you don't know by now, The Paint Yard is a rare outpost for premium German spray paint company Montana, sells the competition brands too, and backs what aerosol action we have in town. More to the point, they've been showing national talent since opening the gallery last fall. And while showing urban art at the joint that supplies the street may smack of celebrity endorsements, ponder this: How many indie art spaces in any town can keep the doors open on a regular (I don't mean once or twice a month) basis? Yeah, the art biz is mercantile, too.

Before Miami native Chef Douglas Rodriguez became the "Godfather of nuevo Latino cuisine," he was a young chef working on Lincoln Road looking for a dedicated sous chef. Luckily, an aspiring artist named Miguel Paredes happened to know a thing or two about cooking. The two not only worked together, but grew alongside each other. Now, nearly 30 years later and after climbing to the top of their respective professions, Paredes and Rodriguez teamed up again to help Hennessy celebrate Latin music and culture Thursday night following the Latin Billboard Awards.

"It's an honor coming together to celebrate Latinos here in Miami and how we 'Never Stop, Never Settle,'" said Paredes while dropping the Hennessy slogan that is part of the global brand's campaign to celebrate all that is Latino. 


